The college mostly has students weak in English, from poor and difficult backgrounds. The students are used to spoon feeding with ideas; basic vocabulary, rote learning and they are not used to express their views and opinion. Due to lack of writing practice they are not able to write answers to the questions in the examinations, appear for interview and have loss of confidence in reading, writing and speaking in English.

4. The Practice

SELA

The English Department carries out a membership drive for all the students of the college belonging to all the disciplines to join SELA. The students are explained the benefits of joining the association. A whatsapp group is formed and the students are regularly informed about the activities carried out by the association. Generally there is a meeting of all the members of the association on the second and fourth Saturday of the month. Students read out their creative writings. The Faculty members of the English department teach various aspects of creative writing to the students. Well known authors, writers, poets, editors, teachers are invited and students receive guidance from them. An Online Certificate Course in Creative Writing was organised during the Pandemic and creative writers

from all over India were invited to share their experiences, motivate and guide the students. Advanced learners are mostly benefitted but results have shown that even the poor in English have improved a lot. The students are encouraged to read on different topics. Discussions and debates are organised by the association. These students are then encouraged to participate in the intracollegiate and intercollegiate competitions. The students have brought laurels to the college by not only participating in the University, state and national level competitions but have bagged top prizes too. The creative writings of these students are published in the Youth Zone section of the leading English daily (The Hitavada). Most of them have been rewarded and appreciated by the public. The college also publishes the creative writings in forms of poems and articles in the college magazine "Prerana". The English department had also organised "An International Poets meet" wherein the students got an opportunity to listen to poets from all around the world. Some of the students participated in the meet. An Anthology of Poems was also published by the department. The department also conducts two certificate courses- Certificate Course in English communicative Skills and Certificate Course in HRD and Soft Skills. This also supplements the activity of the Association.

Quiz Competitions, Book reviews are conducted as best practice by the Knowledge Resource Centre (Library). Knowledge Resource Centre (Library) conducts G.K quiz series for the college students. Also, the English department conducts quiz competitions, teacher for today on the prescribed syllabus so that students are benefitted in the university examinations too.

Book Review

"Book Review of the Week "activity was conducted by Knowledge Resource centre (Library) in the session 2021-22 and onwards. As a part of this activity, students were asked to issue different books based on their interest. All the students were encouraged to issue books beyond their syllabus like novels, fiction, personality development books, biographies, general books on varied topics which cater to their reading interest and increasing their knowledge base on varied subjects. After the student finished reading his choice of he or she was asked to submit book review of the same. After reviewing 'book review' submitted by the student, every week two different books were displayed in the library along with the 'Book Review' written by the students. Every week two books from the library collection got visibility and this led to encouragement for the students to read beyond their syllabus, enhance their reading habit and get more inclined for creative reading and also all the students got a wonderful platform wherein their keenness towards reading and writing skills got recognition and visibility.

Sutavne who gave them prizes. The creative writings of Bhagyalaxmi Atrey, Chinmay Joshi, Shital Pangul, Aishwarya Thakre, Kalyanti Gadre, Sakshi Nagose, Bhavi Deshmukh, Apurva Khode and Trishna Bhange were published in the college magazine Prerna.

Book Review Activity

Actually this was done with the objective to encourage students to read and grow. As the students slowly and steadily started participating in the activity, the demand for more books of different genre increased and usability of library also increased manifold. Students found a way to express themselves by way of this activity. As the choice of the book selection was in the hands of the students, overwhelming response was received for this activity. Also non serious library users became seriously engaged and participated in this activity. Even by way of this activity students became role ambassador in proliferating and canvassing various books from the library collection as well taking lead in encouraging their fellow classmate to be part of this activity.

In this activity nearly all the students of the college were the beneficiaries. As the book review of 2 books/ week were displayed at the entrance of the library. All the library users could read the review. Also many students on reading the review wanted to issue the book for their reading and also submitted the review after their reading. Till now 102 books have been reviewed by the students as a part of this activity.

Though we try to motivate majority of the students to join SELA still only good and advanced learners are seeing taking interest in this activity. Hence the activity gets focussed on advanced learners. We have seen a good number of students getting published. All the members get an opportunity to present their writings. Grammatical mistakes are corrected, ideas are given to the students because in general they are used to spoon feeding and reading from readymade notes. Boosting their confidence to writing on their own is a herculean task. The students are asked to read and given tasks within their experience level so that they are motivated to read and write on their own. As they are poor they do not have books. They are motivated to read textbooks and other books from the library.
