NAAC Sponsored Online National Seminar

On

Quality Enhancement and Sustenance Measures in Teaching, Learning and Assessment

Organized on

20 January 2022

REPORT

The seminar commenced with the welcome address by **Principal Dr. Tanuja Nafde**.

IQAC Coordinator Dr. Manjushree Sardeshpande delivered the inaugural address emphasizing on the significance of the seminar.

The Chief –Guest and Inaugurator of the Seminar was the **Vice- Chancellor of R.T.M.Nagpur University, Nagpur Dr. Subhash Chaudhary**.

Dr Subhash Chaudhary in his inaugural address expressed satisfaction on the organization of a National level seminar on Quality Enhancement and Sustenance Measures in Teaching, Learning and Assessment .

He stated that the students nowadays no longer need the mere theoretical knowledge from the teachers. They are exposed to knowledge because they have a direct access to all the sources of knowledge through internet. This, he stated as the one important reason for the decline in engagement ratio.

The needs and expectations of the students are very different. They are much more and multi-dimensional also here interests are different. Our present education system is repetitive and obsolete. A tailor made education system is needed. Dr Chaudhari stated that the New Education Policy aims at catering to the needs of the students as well as the industries. Mere theoretical knowledge handicaps the students because they are rejected by the industries. The New Education Policy takes into account the fact that every student has a skill and it must be developed. He stressed on the fact that outcome based learning is the need of the hour. Outcome based learning is possible through concept understanding. Dr Chaudhari lamented the fact that students know the answers of questions even when they don't know the concepts. It is therefore very important that activity based learning should be given to students. According to Blooms s Taxonomy there are six levels of learning but in the present scenario only two levels are hardly achieved. If all the six levels of learning are to be achieved then activity based learning must be imparted.

Dr Chaudhari also very rightly said that the assessment and evaluation systems were as important as activity based learning sessions. Time to time evaluation, continuous assessment, rubrics are important to know the achievement level of the students. Quality enhancement is possible if teaching, learning and assessment go hand in hand. In order to impart outcome based education to students, the

teachers must be equally equipped. Institutions should arrange workshops for training teachers for such new challenges. He urged that awareness programs must be arranged for implementation of the new education policy. Teachers must design the activity based syllabus which would not be merely theoretical.

By way of conclusion Dr Chaudhari stated that all institutions academicians and concerned stakeholders should come together for the successful implementation of the New Education Policy to fulfill the aspirations of the students and make them job worthy. He congratulated the IQAC team and the Principal of R. S. Mundle Dharampeth Arts and Commerce College for taking initiative in organizing the seminar and expressed the hope that the seminar would be helpful to all the participants for the successful implementation of the new education policy in the good interests of the students.

Presidential Address by Advocate Aurangabadkar- President of Dharampeth Education Society

Mr Ulhas Aurangabadkar, President Dharampeth Education Society at the outset congratulated the Principal and the team of IQAC for organizing a national level webinar on such a vital issue of Quality enhancement and sustenance measures in teaching and learning.

Citing an example of a genuine problem of students of Gadchiroli district of Maharashtra in the recent pandemic period related to the online education and the total absence of internet facility in Gadchiroli, Mr Aurangabadkar said that the Nagpur Bench of Bombay High court entertained the problem as a PIL. The students wanted to know as to what were they to do when their district does not have a broad band facility and with all tall claims the online education started. They were being deprived of the education, thrown out of the teaching learning process.

He regretted the fact that being the remote and very backward district the Net facilities there are not available to students. Many families cannot afford an extra smart phone. He urged the organizers of the Webinar to address these genuine problems of students. He expressed the hope that under the able guidance of our dynamic VC Dr Subhash Chaudhari the goal would be achieved and challenges would be addressed.

Keynote Address by Dr. Leena Gahane- Deputy Advisor NAAC, Bengaluru

Dr. Leena Gahane began her lecture with introduction about aim, process and outcome of Education. She emphasized that Education is the Prime mover of the society & pillar of National Development.

In her lecture she explained the vision, mission and 5 core values of NAAC. Further she explained the elements of Quality Assurance System in Higher Education along with external and internal assessment and its Impact on educational institutions. She also focused on 6 Aspects of National Quality Assurance Systems in Higher Education in response to NAAC. She also talked about Quality Management System & 7 Criteria's of NAAC which is one of the essentials and a key factor for the growth of educational institutions.

She also explained beautifully the Knowledge Ladder i.e. a journey of Teaching & Learning. She further emphasized on the 7 key indicators and its weightage of criteria 2 i.e. Teaching, Learning & Evaluation. Further with the help of a Short story she also alerted not to be ignorant but rather sense, understand and be knowledgeable while running and know the reason behind it rather than just running.

She also threw light on Teaching-Learning process while focusing on teachers to be innovative and meet the expectations of Students by developing more and more entrepreneurial skills. Further she focused on experiential learning, Blended Learning, Innovative Teaching Strategies, and Compared the modern education system with that of old Gurukul Education system of Learning and Evaluation.

She said IQAC is considered as the Heart of the Educational Institution so it should be managed, functioned and reviewed properly. Further being a motivational speaker also, she concluded her lecture quoting sentences by Swami Vivekananda and a new #Hash Tag of Life i.e. Be a Change See a Change, Be Vocal for Local & Reach Global- Atmanirbhar Bharat.

Session:1 Dr. L. Manjunath Rao, Deputy Advisor NAAC, Bengaluru

The 1st session of this national seminar was addressed by DR.L. MANJUNATH RAO, Deputy Advisor, NAAC Bengaluru. He began his lecture with short and effective introduction of NAAC's contribution in Quality Enhancement and Sustenance Measures for Teaching, Learning and Assessment. In his lecture at first he explained all the seven criteria of NAAC in detail and then he explained the concept of 'assessment' as 'Performance evaluation' and 'accreditation' as 'Certification of quality'. He discussed about the path to reach best accreditation level by demonstrating the Ladder Form. He also highlighted the necessities and the requisites involved in the SSR preparation process. Dr. Rao emphasized on time frame for submissions and method of distribution of Metrics and KIs. He threw light on the grading system, and eligibility criteria to apply for Assessment and Accreditation process of NACC. He further guided on the registration process of HEI's (Higher Education Institution). He opined that once done with the registration process HEI needs to complete IQA application process. He elaborated on the structure and format of all necessary documents required in registration process. Another important point discussed by Dr.Rao was providing the extended profile of college and department wise report showcasing the activities and achievements.

In addition to this he explained the DVV process and the Student Satisfaction Survey (SSS) He explained the process involved in the peer teams visit and score sheet concept adopted by PEER team was also explained. Dr.Rao also explained the consequences of grading and how the Accreditation impacts the profile of college. While concluding he provided the helpdesk details.

Session:2 Dr.S. Badrunnissa – Head, Krupanidhi Group of Institutions, Bengaluru

The Resource person for the session Dr. S. Badrunnissa emphasized on "Role of Administration in enhancing the quality in Teaching and Learning Process. The session discussed about how administration is directly connected with the teaching-learning process and its improvement and the way administrators should make it clear that they are available to promote as well as support all the procedures needed to ensure smooth teaching learning system build up. Another striking feature of the session was that it mentioned about the role of administration when its scope also extends in areas of confirming the fact that evaluations are meaningful based on feedback from stakeholders. The resource person also highlighted that administrators must be unbiased with everyone so that, the efforts put in by the teachers and administrators reach all beneficiaries. The Resource Person also opined that administrators should set their policy with a future foresight, keeping targets in achievable reach, take logical and feasible steps and revise them at regular intervals. From the session it became amply clear that strategies for Teaching and learning initiated and implemented by Management, should be committed to provide with a liberal education pattern and strategies designed separately for slow and fast learners. The session also dealt with effective and continuous evaluation mechanism so

that lacunae if any can be nipped in the bud. The Guest speaker also explained the techniques related to OBE, and other viable schemes of evaluation. It was evident that the speaker was of the opinion that to bring about a sea change in Teaching- Learning- Evaluation mechanism, the students should be constantly motivated for learning something new, carry out innovations and research, engage themselves into field study and discourse. The Guest speaker also advocated the importance of entrepreneurial development and insisted upon the administrators to introduce and implement such ED activities in order to make learning process more employability oriented.

Session: 3 was conducted by **Mr. Peeyush Pahade**, President of IQAC Cluster of India and IQAC Coordinator of H.V. Desai college, Pune

Dr. Peeyush Pahade was the resource person for the third session, he expressed his views on the topic “Role of IQAC in Analysis and Governance of HEI”. He specified that the IQAC is the apex body which performs the function of analysis. He stated, one who analyzes can govern the system better and therefore IQAC plays important role in analysis and governance. The primary function of IQAC is to take quality initiatives to bring the institution to higher level from its earlier position. IQAC is a mechanism which ensures that every component of the institution functions properly and innovatively. He categorized the initiatives taken by the IQAC under three heads, Quality Assurance, Quality Sustenance and Quality Enhancement. He said, when we talk about assurance it is always downward. Assurance originates from the top level, consequently all the policies and rules are the parts of assurance. Whereas, enhancement originates from the bottom and moves upward. To simplify the concepts, he gave an example of vaccination drive in India. in which, he explained that, the statement everybody must get the vaccine is quality assurance and providing mechanism into that effect and getting all the people vaccinated is quality enhancement. Therefore, he said, enhancement has to be initiated at the bottom of the pyramid and what goes in between assurance and enhancement is Quality Sustenance. He said that there are two aspects of research, one is research policy and other is research papers. If an institution has a research policy that each faculty member should contribute in research by writing research papers, it is an initiative to facilitate quality assurance and contributing research papers by the faculty members is to facilitate quality enhancement. Whereas, excellent placement record of the institution for the past five years is an example of quality sustenance. He expounded that documentation is the primary work of the IQAC for analysis and quality promotion. There are three types of documentation, Academic documentation, Administrative documentation and Governance and Strategic documentation. Academic documentation signifies enhancement level of the institution, administrative documentation signifies the sustenance level, they serve as a measure for sustenance level and Governance and Strategic Documentation signify quality assurance level. He further stated that the IQAC has to decide whether the particular activity has to be conducted for assurance, enhancement or sustenance purpose. He emphasized that the feedback and student satisfaction surveys are the mechanisms to enhance the quality.

He also explained the various indicators such as input, process, output, outcome and impact and how the NAAC measures the performance of the institution with the help of these inputs. The session was interactive and equally informative.

Valedictory Address

Chief- Guest: Dr. Jyoti Patil- Principal of Renuka College, Nagpur Address

Dr.Jyoti Patil said that education (Vidya) was considered to be ‘the third eye’ of man, which not only gave him insight but also mental strength and equilibrium of material and spiritual

life. “The ideal of all education, all training, should be man-making.” She explained that, good quality education is one that provides all learners with capabilities they require to become economically productive, develop sustainable livelihoods, contribute to peaceful and democratic societies and enhance individual well-being. The shift is from teaching to learning. The National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 promulgated on 29th July 2020 has proposed many reforms at all levels of education system from pre-school to highest level of education which includes increase focus on early childhood care, reform the current exam and teaching system, more stress on teacher training and research culture and restructure the education regulatory framework.

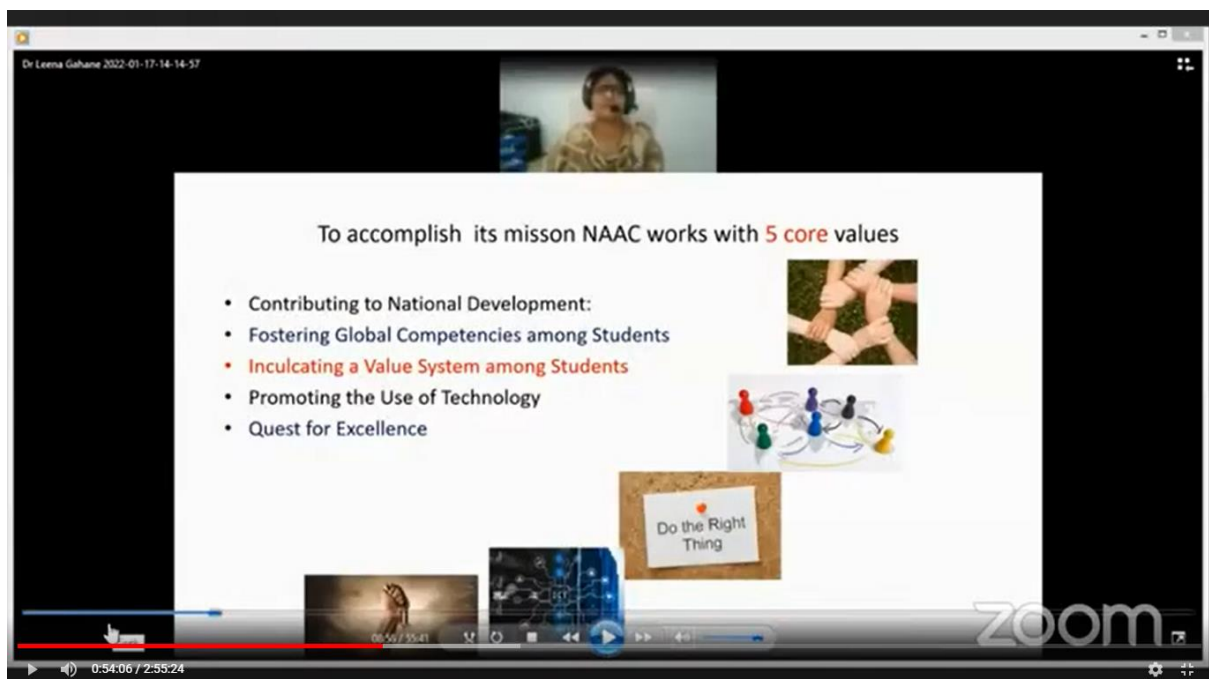
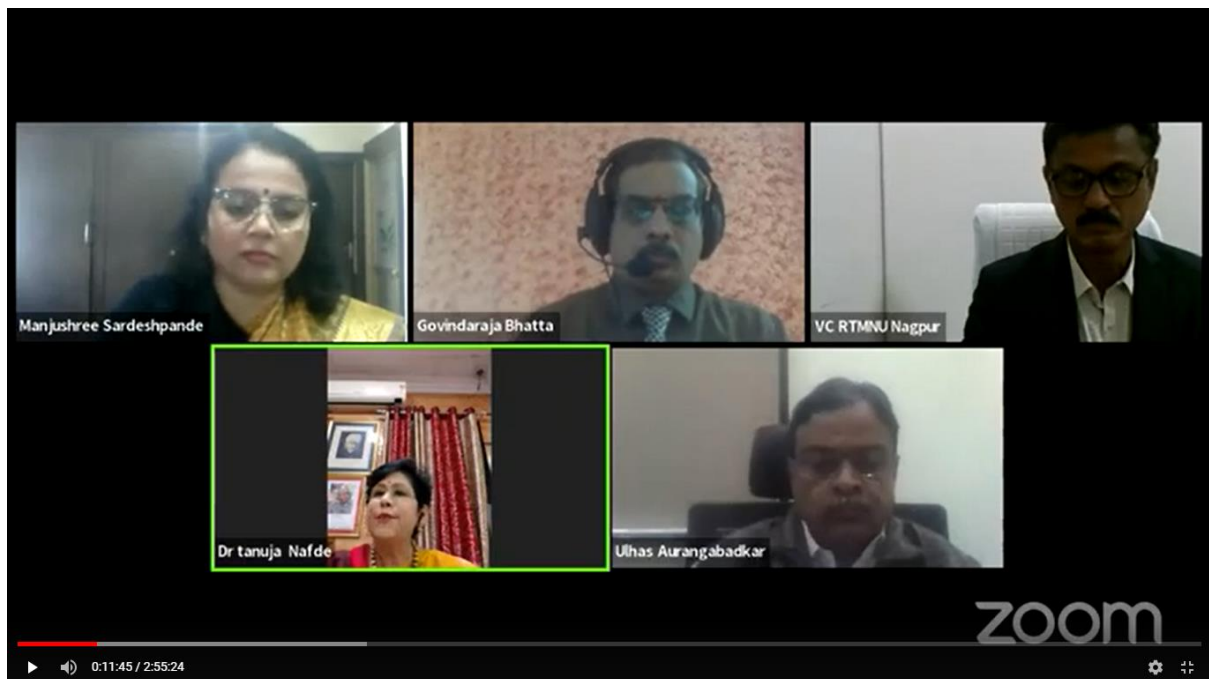

Dr. Leena Gahane, Deputy Advisor NAAC delivering the Keynote Address

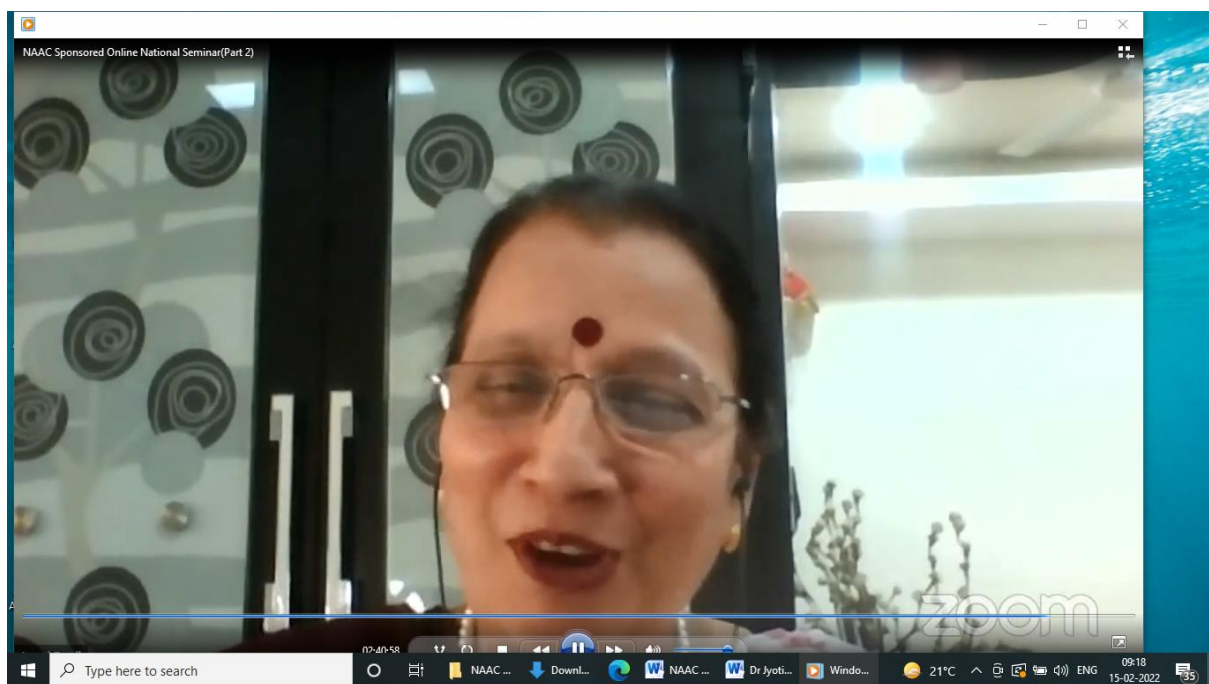
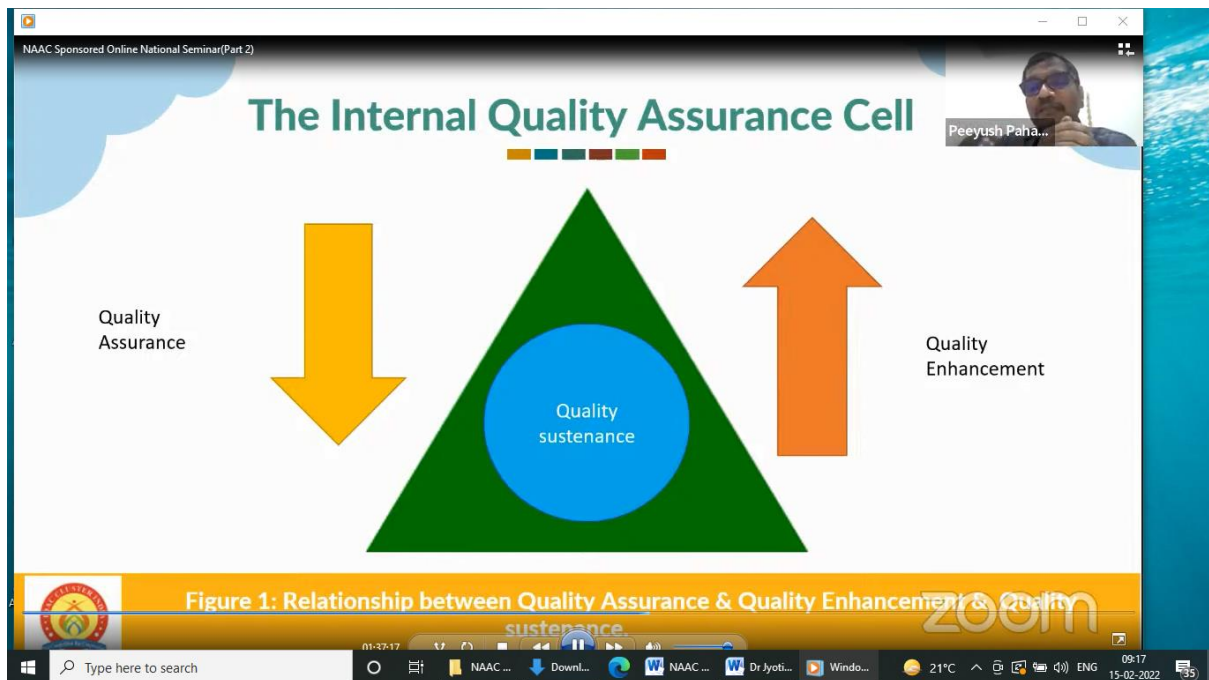
